RESPONSE TO GOD'S WORD

With gratitude for our Reformed heritage on this Reformation Sunday, let us stand together and affirm our faith with words from our creeds and confessions.

* Affirmation of Faith

ONE:

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

(The Nicene Creed; The Apostles' Creed, 2.3)

ALL:

We confess and acknowledge one God alone, distinct in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, to whom alone we must cleave, and in whom alone we put our trust.

(The Scots Confession, 3.01)

CHOIR:

We believe that we belong – body and soul, in life and in death –not to ourselves but to our faithful Savior, Jesus Christ.

(The Heidelberg Catechism, 4.001)

MEN:

We believe that all things are governed by the Providence of God.

(The Second Helvetic Confession, 5.029)

WOMEN:

We believe that the Lord our God was pleased to make a second covenant of grace, wherein he freely offered unto sinners life and salvation by Jesus Christ.

(The Westminster Confession of Faith, 6.039)

ONE:

We believe that the chief end of humankind is to glorify God, and to enjoy God forever.

(The Shorter Catechism, 7.001)

ALL:

We believe that there is but one only, the living and true God. God is a Spirit, in and of himself infinite in being, glory, blessedness and perfection, all-sufficient, eternal, unchangeable, incomprehensible, everywhere present, almighty, knowing all things, most wise, most holy, most just, most merciful and gracious, long-suffering, and abundant in goodness and truth. (The Larger Catechism, 7.117) CHOIR:

The church's commission, upon which its freedom is founded, consists in delivering the message of the free grace of God to all people in Christ's stead, and therefore in the ministry of his own Word and work through sermon and Sacrament.

(The Theological Declaration of Barmen, 8.26.)

MEN:

We believe that the life, death, resurrection, and promised coming of Jesus Christ has set the pattern for the church's mission.

WOMEN:

We believe that unity is both a gift and an obligation for the church of Jesus Christ. Through the work of God's Spirit, unity is a binding force. At the same time, unity must be earnestly pursued and sought. Our unity must become visible to the world.

(*The Confession of 1967, 9.32*)

ONE:

We believe that separation and hatred between people and groups is sin, already conquered by Christ.

Anything threatening our unity has no place in the church.

(The Confession of Belhar, 10.3) With believers in every time and place,

ALL:

we rejoice that nothing in life or in death can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Amen. (A Brief Statement of Faith, 11.5, 11.6)
